We are excited to announce that Diplomat Middle School is now the home of a brand new Automated External Defibrillator (AED). An AED is a lifesaving tool that is used to address a sudden cardiac arrest. Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States, according to the American Heart Association. Early and effective CPR/intervention has been demonstrated to double or triple the chance of survival. Members of our administration and staff have received specialized training through Project ADAM. This project also donated our new AED that could save lives. The device is safe to be used on people of any age who are experiencing cardiac arrest. It is located next to the stage in the cafeteria. With heavy hearts, we share the sad news of the passing of Lorna Ermacora. She fought a 21 month battle with pancreatic cancer, continuing to work with her students on a daily basis until just one week before her passing on September 17th. She was strong in her fight and dedicated to her students and her school. Before joining the Diplomat family, Lorna taught as an Open End teacher at Challenger Middle School for one year, and then spent three years at Gateway Charter High School teaching Language Arts. Lorna began teaching at Diplomat Middle School in August of 2012, teaching 6th grade Language Arts. Through the years, she also taught yearbook, journalism, 8th grade Career class, and 8th grade Language Arts. She loved reading and writing and sharing those passions with her students. Her students knew that she would not accept less than their best work. They thought she was funny, entertaining, strict, and held high expectations of them. She also served Diplomat as a Newspaper advisor, girls' volleyball coach, and co-chair of our school marketing committee.

Lorna was married for over 18 years and they have a teenage daughter who attends one of our West Zone high schools.

REMINDERS TO PARENTS:

It is important that our students are in school everyday and that they are on time for each class, including the beginning of the day. Just as students receive a detention during the day for being tardy to classes, students will also receive a detention on every third unexcused tardy to school. Therefore, every 3rd unexcused tardy will result in an after school detention.

If your morning schedule is tight, you may use our before school care for a small fee each school day. Students may come on campus at or after 9:15 am, without the need of our fee based care. Students who arrive before 9:15 am, become a part of our before school care at a cost to parents of \$35 for registration and \$5 per day that is attended.

Student must be picked up at dismissal each day, 4:00pm, or at the designated end time of any school sponsored event.

Lee County School Board Policy 4.16:

No student shall be released within the final 30 minutes of the school day unless the principal/designee determines it is an emergency.

4 KEY FINDINGS for Middle Grades

- 1. Middle grade attendance and GPA provide the best indication of how students will perform in high school classes.
- 2. Students who are chronically absent or who receive F's in the middle grades are at high risk of being off track for graduation in ninth grade, and possibly dropping out of school.
- 3. College readiness depends on strong grades in middle school, as well as high school.
- 4. Improving grades and attendance in the middle grades can have a large pay-off for high school success; even more so than improving test scores.
